

DIAPERING PROCEDURE

Must be posted at each diapering changing area

Preparation	Wash Hands.	Clean disposable diaper.
	Gather necessary supplies so that they are easily accessible during diaper change and within reach	 Disposable wipes or dampened paper towels. Diapering cream, labeled with child's first and last name (if provided). Roll paper or nonabsorbent paper sheets. Gloves (a must with stool).
		Extra clothes (if needed).
	Cover diapering surface	The paper must be the length of the child: have clean paper within reach.
	Put gloves on	Mandatory for stool diapers, and if anticipation of contact with blood. Recommended with urine diapers.
Dirty Phase	Place child on diapering surface. Child should not bring any items including pacifiers to the changing table	Keep one hand on the child the entire time. Keep other children away from diapering area. Remove child's clothing, put soiled clothing aside.
	Remove soiled diaper	Roll diaper inward. Place diaper directly into a covered waste container or out of child's kick space/reach.
	Cleanse diaper area of child	Cleanse from front to back including skin creases. Use disposable wipes or the three-paper towel method (soap, rinse, dry). Place wipes in waste container or out of child's kick space/reach
	Remove Gloves	Place gloves in waste container or out of child's kick space/reach.
Clean Phase	Put clean paper under child	If needed.
	Ointment, as directed	Use clean glove, swabs, or tongue blades to apply, remove glove.
	Diaper and dress the child	
	Wash child's and provider's hands	Thoroughly with soap and warm running water for 20 seconds using posted procedure.
	Return child to activity	Staff immediately returns to the diapering area for clean up.
Clean Up	Dispose of soiled items	Put diaper, wipes, paper towels, changing paper, cotton swabs, and gloves into the plastic-lined waste container.
		Put soiled clothing in a plastic bag for parent/guardian to take home.
	Disinfect per product instructions	Diapering surface and all surfaces that were touched.
	Wash hands	Thoroughly with soap and warm running water for 20 seconds using posted procedure.
ent	Record	Diaper change on daily sheet or electronic method.
Document	Report	Any concerns to parents.
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CHANGING PULL-UPS/TOILET LEARNING PROCEDURE

Note: This procedure is recommended for wet pull-ups and wet underwear only. For pull-ups/underwear soiled with feces, follow diapering procedure.

Wash hands	Thoroughly with soap and warm running water for 15-20 seconds using

Assemble supplies (within reach)	 Clean disposable pull-up* or underwear. Disposable wipes or paper towels.

	4. Plastic bags, clean clothing (if needed).	
Put gloves on	See gloving recommendations per program policies.	
Stand child by the toilet	1. Provide privacy.	
Stand Cand by the tonce animalian	 Assist child to remove clothing, if necessary. Put soiled clothing in a plastic bag. Avoid contaminating other clothing items or surfaces. 	
Teach child to remove pull-up	Tear sides of pull-up to remove. Place pull-up directly into plastic bag, tie and place in a plastic lined waste container.	
Teach child to wipe bottom	 Teach child to wipe from front to back (once per wipe). Use the child's own disposable wipes. 	
	2. Place wipes in waste container.	
Remove gloves	Place gloves in waste container.	
Encourage Independent Tolleting	1. Allow child to sit on toilet.	
	2. Praise for toileting attempt/success.	
	3. Allow child to wipe bottom.	
	4. Encourage child to flush toilet.5. Follow "Clean Phase" procedure.	
	3. Pollow Clean Flase procedure.	
Teach child to put on pull-	Have child sit on toilet to put on clean pull-up/underwear and pants or stand to	
	place diaper between legs.	
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Wash child's hands	Thoroughly with soap and warm running water for 15-20 seconds using posted procedure.	
Doturn shild to activity	Staff raturns to dianaring area	
ACTULAL CHARLES ACTIVITY	Staff returns to diapering area.	
Clean and disinfect	Any soiled areas including cleaning and disinfecting toilet seat.	
Wash hands	Thoroughly with soap and warm running water for 15-20 seconds using posted procedure.

Acknowledge Toilet Learning	Praise child for all attempts/successes in toilet learning process.
