Categorically Eligible

*(Approved by Policy Council on 2/19/2021)* Age and income will be the first consideration when enrolling children. When two or more children have the same amount of points: the child with a referral will be given first consideration, and then they will be ranked by income. The child with the lowest income (based on family size) would be ranked higher. If Income Eligible AND Categorically Eligible, count points for both. If a child is already enrolled in a partnering class, priority is given over a child not already enrolled. When determining income categories, 1-100% of poverty would be enrolled first. 101-130% of poverty not to exceed 35% of the total enrollment, and over 130% of poverty not to exceed 10% of enrollment if needed for full enrollment.
